Voters Can Sign Petitions.

A registered voter may sign the nominating petition of as many candidates of his party for the same office as he chooses, according to an opinion of Attorney-General Crawford given to the county clerk of Josephine County. The attorney general holds that if a Republican registered voter, for instance, signs the petition of half a dozen Republican candidates for the gubernatorial nomination the voter's name is to be counted on each petition. He says the law intends to make it as easy as possible for candidates to get before the people.

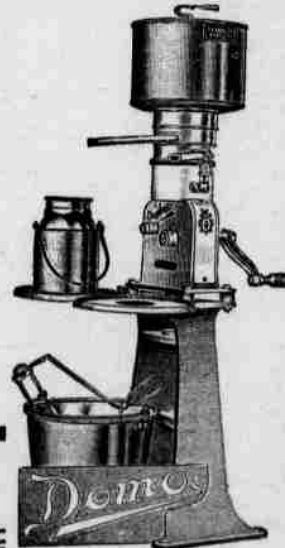
