Falls City School Complimented.
The manual training work in the Falls City High School is proving quite profitable to the district, as well as to the boys who are taking the course. This is shown by a report made to Superintendent of Public Instruction Churchill by Assistant State Superintendent Frank K. Welles, who recently made an official visit to this school. Falls City is a lumbering town and the high school boys seem to take naturally to wood work. Although their original equipment consisted of only a few hand tools, they have made 11 work-benches and are constantly adding to their equipment with the money which they receive through the manufacture and sale of furniture. They made a mission tar-

ble for the bank, a book-case and a cabinet for one of the physicians, and they now have an order for an ice chest and cabinet for a dentist and a writing table and set of chairs for one of the hotels. The quality of the work turned out by students is of such superior quality that the demand has increased until they are now unable to fill all of the orders for their product which come to them. The manual training work is being done under the direction of Principal H. E. Barnhart.

New Method of curing PILES and FISTULA as used by DR. TOEL

The routine treatment for piles as used by most physicians and surgeons is either to tie them off with a string, or an elastic ligature, and let them drop off by mortification of the portion tied. This method causes intense pain and often is the cause of blood poisoning, the products of the mortification being absorbed by the system; or the piles are cut away with the knife and the wound sewed up over it. This method has often the disadvantage of considerable loss of blood from the enlarged veins, and the danger of blood poisoning from a sewed wound in the rectum which is very hard to make aseptic, the faces passing constantly over it, and even when sewed up, tearing a small space apart and infecting the fresh wound. The method of rejecting piles with carbolic oil and other similar substances has, in a number of cases, caused sudden death, the oil globules getting into the circulation and clogging up the blood vessels in the lungs. Injecting substances that coagulate the blood into blood vessels is always dangerous.

Dr. Toel has for 30 years used a method by means of electricity, which avoids all these dangers.

The pile tumors are removed in a few minutes without the loss of a drop of blood. As there are no open blood vessels and lymphatic vessels left to become infected there is no danger of blood poisoning; the patient is not weakened by the loss of blood as in a knife operation, there is very seldom any pain after the operation, while the operation itself extremely seldom requires chloroform or ether, which he uses only if the pile tumors are extremely large and there are very many of them.

The routine treatment for bleeding piles and flat pile growths as used by most physicians and surgeons is to apply nitric acid in the fuming state to the growths. Anybody can imagine how intense and long continued the pain would be from such a procedure. Aside from this, it is hard to limit the effects of a fluid caustic which often destroys for more than necessary.

Dr. Toel uses three different methods as they may seem best suited to each case. In the first, he uses the same method as in pile tumors, destroying the piles instantly. This is the best suited to cases where there are only a few well-localized pile growths. In the second method where the pile growths are all around the circumference of the bowel, Dr. Toel destroys them by an electric current of low voltage, or brings them to absorption by a current of very high voltage. Both these methods are practically painless and are free from danger of blood poisoning, while of course there is not the slightest loss of blood.

The routine treatment for fistula as used by most physicians and surgeons is either to cut them with a knife or seissors, or to string an elastic ligature through them and tie this, thus severing the outside of the fistula canal by mortification. The cutting method has the danger of all such operations of loss of blood and blood poisoning, also requiring chloroform or ether. The elastic ligature method has the danger of blood poisoning and the intense pain from the slowly contracting ligature. Aside from this, both methods will only lay open the main canal of the fistula; but how of the many branches, blind canals that fork off from the main canal, and of which Dr. Toel once found 37 in a case of fistula?

When using cutting instruments the flow of blood obscures them, they cannot be found, and in a short time form a new fistula. In using the elastic ligature they cannot even be seen. In both methods the lining of the fistula is not destroyed and usually forms a new fistula in a short time.

The electric method as used by Dr. Toel for 30 years, causes no loss of blood there is no danger of blood poisoning, as the blood vessels are all sealed up during the process of the operation; the pus forming lining of the fistula is entirely destroyed and as there is no blood to obscure the openings of the many blind branches forking off from the main canal, these can all be found and destroyed, one after the other. There is no pain after the operation, and only in the most severe cases, where there are many branches, it is necessary to use chloroform or ether.

If you have not seen the Dallas Observer of April 14th and 17th, get it and read about Dr. Toel's cure of cancers and tumors, also April 10th about treatment of kidney diseases.


