



A MILLION DOLLAR SERMON

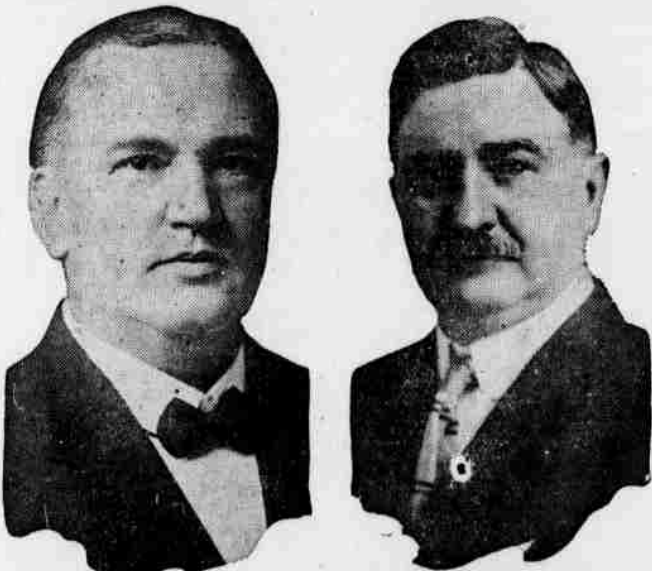
Seated in his Chicago home, Dr. Frank W. Gunsaulus, the world's greatest preacher, is seen in the above picture talking to members of The Elwynn Trio, the musical artists selected by him to furnish half-hour concerts preceding his lectures on the chautauqua this summer. He is the star attraction at the local chautauqua and will deliver his latest masterpiece of eloquence, "The New American," although there have been many requests for his famous "Savonarola."

A million dollar sermon was once preached by this pulpit king. One of the regular attendants at Central Church, the Chicago congregation of 4,000 souls served by Dr. Gunsaulus, was Phillip Armour, king of meat packers. In one of his prophetic moods the minister painted a word picture of the modern youth ambitious to make the most of himself, not as a scholar, but in the technical trades. Where can a young man of such ambition find training? asked the preacher. An eloquent plea was then made for the establishment of a technical institute to prepare young men for the strenuous battle of life.

At conclusion of the service Phillip Armour advanced to the pulpit, shook hands with Dr. Gunsaulus and said he would give one million dollars to build and endow such a school provided the doctor would accept the presidency of the institution. A bargain was made on the spot. That was over 20 years ago, and Armour Institute has become one of the most important educational institutions of the country. Dr. Gunsaulus is still its head, dividing his time between executive duties, the pulpit and the platform.

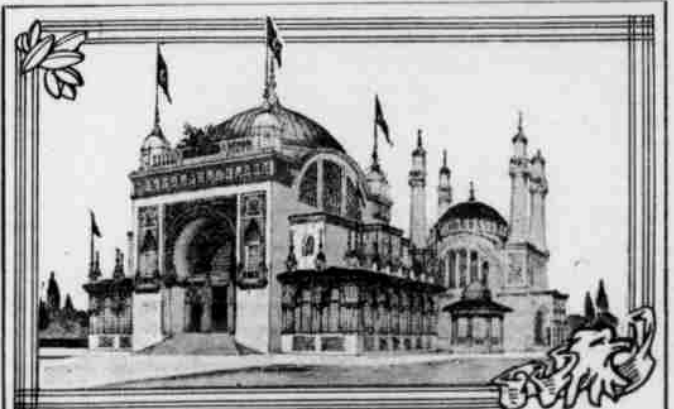


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THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT BUILDING AT THE PANAMA-PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION.
