It is the simple and natura right to life, to health and to hap When man understands his divine rights he cannot be made the victim of evil, sin or disease.

If, however, mortal man has not learned of his rights to immunity from evil and sickness, or is afraid of these claims and puts in no defense, or if knowing his rights he neglects to defend himself, in any of these cases judgment is taken against him as though the claims were true, since strong is done to average their fall. nothing is done to expose their fal sity. My friends, we have been al lowing unjust judgment to be taken against us. We have not been defending our rights to life, health and happiness, sometimes because of negligence, more often because of ignorance, Christian Science shows us how to make our defense, expose the falsity of evil's claims and preserve the integrity of our well-being.
