The Journal doubts whether it would be wise to locate the proposed one normal school at or very near Portland. A site here would be expensive, and what is a greater objection, a large number of students are better off away from the allurements of a large city. Portland is the most central place, but this advantage does not outweigh these objections.—Portland Journal.

Vastly different is this to the spirit of the Oregonian which wants everything located in Portland that has any money connected with it, especially if there is a chance for the Oregonian to get a finger in the pie. The Journal is eminently correct in this and as a native Oregonian we thank it for this expression of good common sense. We have had grave doubts for some years as to whether there was real need of more than one Normal school, but have of late contended that the report of the Board of Regents should have been accepted by the legislature as final, for the Board had examined into the conditions and it should have known more about the real conditions than any one individual. The present conditions are largely the result of an itch for notoriety by one whom the people of Marion county have seen fit to send to the wrong institution and may be the means of stirring up a feeling of bitterness against that county that will eventually result in the removal of the capital.

There seems to have been one fact lost sight of during the recent Normal muddle in the legislature, and that is a most potent one, of how the Monmouth Normal was acquired. This school had been maintained for years as a sectarian institution and was transferred to the state with the strict understanding that it should be maintained as a Normal, yet, through the efforts of a lot of surplus garbage that escaped the Portland crematory and got into the senate of the Oregon legislature, the state has violated its obligation—has left the people without any place to train the teachers of the common schools. It is enough to make a native forswear his birthplace. Our next move should be to resign statehood and ask to have a territorial form of government arranged for us. It is perhaps well that the people have a chance to vote on a branch asylum for eastern Oregon, for it certainly is needed by at least one individual from that part of the state.

The Student Body met Sunday morning and pledged \$1400 to carry on the school until the end of the year. Where such a

spirit is displayed by those desiring an education it will take more than the actions of a bunch of corporate hirelings from Multnomah county to keep them down. All honor to the young women and young men who compose that body. We believe that when the matter is properly placed before the people of this state that they will rectify the wrong attempted, but not yet consummated, by the State Senate.
