Home Destroyed by Fire

The handsome new dwelling house of Miss Nellie Collins, on her mountain orchard home west of Falls City, was totally destroyed by fire shortly afternoon Wednesday. The loss is about \$3500, with no insurance.

The fire was started by a chimney burning out and the sparks falling on the dry roof. A heavy wind fanned the cinders into a blaze, and the house burned so rapidly that only a small portion of the household furniture could be saved.

The beautiful country home of Miss Collins was built about two years ago, at a cost of about \$2,500. It occupied a sightly location, commanding a view of the entire mountain country west of Falls City—Observer.

After spirited balloting for more than an hour W. B. Ewing was elected marshal of the city. His election occurred on the seventh ballot and the choice was made as a compromise.—Independence Enterprise.
