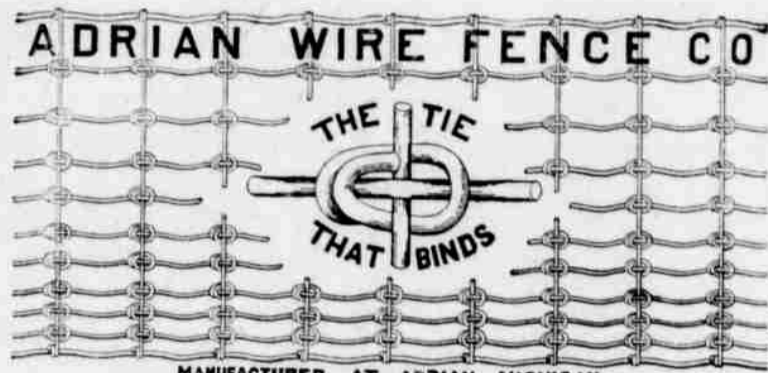


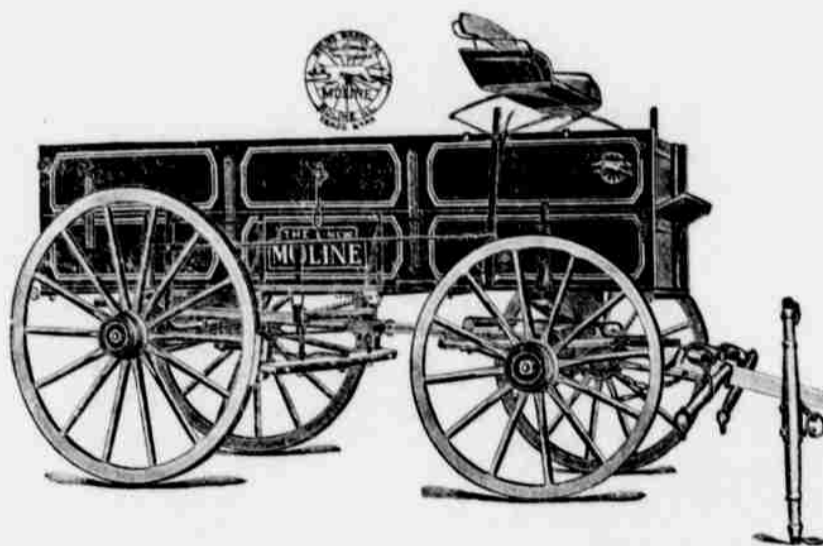

Has the Right Ring

The following statement was given the associated press by Victor Murdock, a Kansas insurgent:

"The significance of the overwhelming insurgency victory in Kansas is two-fold. First, it is a complete repudiation of both Cannon and the system by which he has robbed the people of free government in the House. Scott, Miller and Reeder were chairmen of important House committees while Calderhead was on the ways and means committee. All were beaten because they subscribed to the Cannon system. Second, the Kansas insurgent victory is an effort by the Republicans of Kansas to say with emphasis to the Nation that the Republican party of Kansas, by endorsing Governor Stubbs and Kansas insurgents in Congress stands for immediate and effective legislation framed to drive special and selfish interests out of control in American politics."
