Killed By Falling Tree

Gus Svaat, a laborer in a Black Rock logging camp, was struck by a falling tree and fatally injured Tuesday afternoon, Svaat was missed from camp late Tuesday afternoon. When he failed to appear at supper time, a number of his companions went out to look for him. They found him lying on the ground by a fallen tree, with a severe wound in his head and bleeding profusely. It was apparent that he had been struck by the falling tree.

Doctor Hellworth was called from Falls City to attend him. He was placed in the train Wednesday morning and brought to Dallas, but died just as the train reached the station. The only known relative of the dead man is a brother living in Amsterdam, New York. The body is at Chapman's undertaking parlor and no arrangements will be made for burial until the brother can be heard from. Svaat had been at the Luckiamute camp for several months. He was a good worker and was well liked by his fellow laborers. —Polk County Observer.

Notice of Meeting of Board of Equalization

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, the 17th day of October 1910, the Board of Equalization will meet at the County Courthouse at the city of Dallas, in the county of Polk, state of Oregon, to examine and correct all assessment rolls, to correct all errors in valuations, descriptions or qualities of land, lots, or other property, or incorrectly assessed as to description or quality; or where assessed in the name of a person or persons not the owner thereof or assessed under or beyond the actual cash value thereof and to assess all lands, lots and other property appearing to have been omitted or that was not assessed.

Petitions or applications for

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the reduction of a particular assessment shall be made in writing, verified by the oath of the applicant or his attorney and be filed with the board during the first week it is by law required to be in session, and any petition or application not so made, verified and filed shall not be considered or acted upon by the board.
