**Balance of Circuit Court Pro-
ceedings.**

The case of Charles H Burch against the Salem, Falls City and Western Railway Company, in which the Plaintiff sought to recover \$25,400 damages for the loss of a leg, was decided by a Polk County jury Tuesday in favor of the defendant.

The case was stubbornly contested and many witnesses were examined. After hearing the evidence and the argument of counsel, the jury retired late Tuesday evening and soon decided that the plaintiff's accident was the result of his own lack of precaution. W H Holmes and Frank Holmes, of Salem, were the attorneys for the plaintiff. The railroad company was represented by Oscar Hayter, J E Sibley and F S Senn.

A motion for a new trial was argued before Judge Bennett, Wednesday morning, and was taken under advisement. Docket entries made Tuesday and Wednesday are as follows:
