## Commissioners' Court January 1911 Term

Ordered that the official bond of J. Moran, as constable of Justice District No. 5 be approved.

In the matter of replacing the water pipes in courthouse yard with one inch pipe, it was ordered that contract be awarded to Craven Brothers, lowest bidders.

In the matter of levy of special school tax upon school district that failed to levy a sufficient amount, as required by law: ordered that a special levy for school purposes be made upon the following named school districts within Polk county, to make up the deficiency required by law, as follows: School District No. 18, .5 mills; District 19, .9 mills; District 20, 1.2 mills; District 37, .6 mills; District 48, .6 mills; District 50, 1.3 mills; District 52, 1.0 mills; District 55, 1.0 mills; District 56, 2.0 mills; District 59, 1.3 mills; District 62, .2 mills; District 64, .1 mill; District 67, 5.0 mills. It was ordered that the same be placed on the tax rolls and be collected as other taxes are collected.

Ordered that notice be published asking for bids for 30 cords of grub oak wood, and 30 cords of second growth fir wood, bids to be filed with County Clerk on or before February 1, at 9 a. m.

Ordered that Doctor B. H. McCallon be appointed county health officer.

Ordered that the official bond of J. M. Grant as tax collector be approved.

Ordered that supervisor of Road District No. 14 proceed to open and clear roadway on the Evan Evans land, as charged by the court.

Evan Evans was appointed Supervisor of Road District No. 13.
