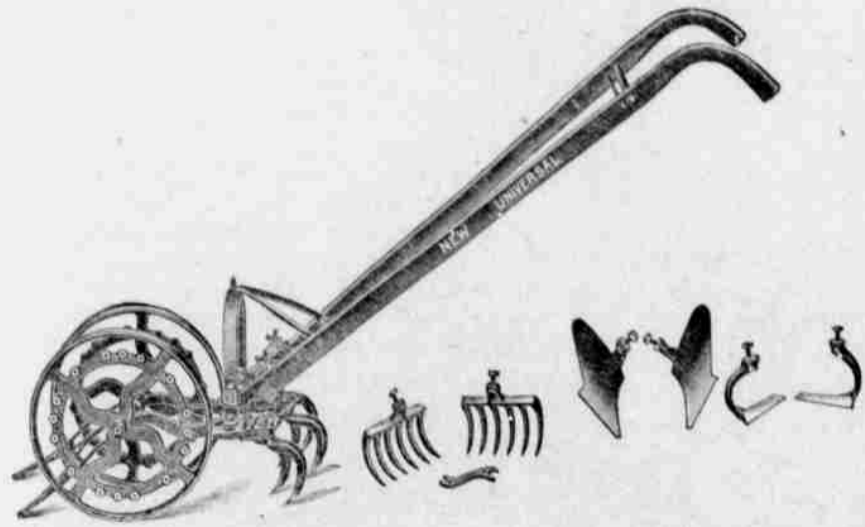

TO HAVE HARD BRICK SURFACE

Contract on School Building to be Changed to hard Brick for Weather Surface

The object was to examine the pressed brick manufactured at that place, with the purpose in view of determining the advisability of having a change made in the contract given for the construction of the new school building so as to have the weather side of the walls built of hard brick.
Willamina has a large plant and makes a good, solid article, samples of which the board brought back for inspection. The visit and examination proved satisfactory and the board has concluded to have the necessary change made in the contract so as to secure the better surface as prayed for in the petition circulated and largely signed by the patrons of the district, the assent being almost unanimous in asking for the change.
