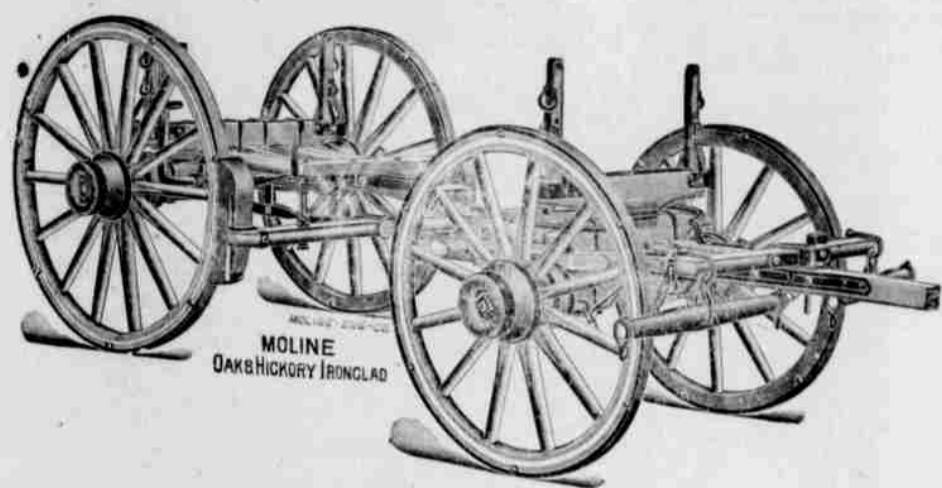


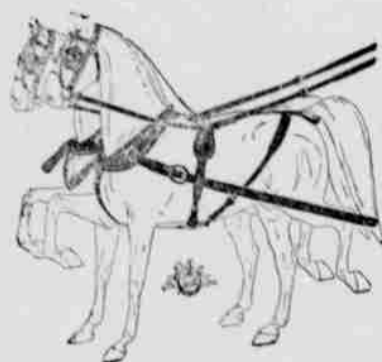

Public Library

The first mail addressed to the Monmouth Public Library Association was received this week—the July and August numbers of Harpers and Scribner. These are all attractive numbers with pictures in colors. The July Harper has a fine article on the Wreckers of the Florida Keys; the serial running in Harpers is Margaret Deland's Iron Woman; the serial in Scribner is Francis Hopkinson Smith's Kennedy Square. Is there anyone in Monmouth who is willing to lend the early chapters of these stories, if they do not care to give the numbers outright.

The following constitution and by-laws are suggested for the Monmouth Public Library Association. Save this copy for future reference as this will be voted upon at the annual meeting to be held August 26th at the lawn social on the Public Library grounds.

ARTICLE I. *Name.*—This organiza-

tion shall be known as the Monmouth Public Library Association.

ARTICLE II. *Object.*—The object of the Association shall be the establishment of a free library in the city of Monmouth.

ARTICLE III. *Membership.*—Any citizen of Monmouth or vicinity may become a member of this Association upon signing the following agreement: I, the undersigned, hereby apply for the privilege of borrowing books from the Monmouth Public Library Association I promise to take good care of all the books I draw, to pay promptly all fines and damages charged against me, and to obey the rules of the library. (The rules are printed on the pocket that is in the back of each book.)

ARTICLE IV. *Officers.*—The officers of the Association shall be a President, Vice-President, and Secretary, who shall be elected annually from its members.

The President shall preside at meetings and perform the duties generally pertaining to the office.

The Vice-President shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform all the duties of the President.

The Secretary shall record all the official actions of the board and have custody of all its official books, records and accounts except those in current use by another officer. The Secretary shall also act as Treasurer of the Association.

ARTICLE V. *Meetings.*—The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the third Monday of each month at 7:30 P. M. in a place to be designated by the President.

The annual meeting shall be held on the fourth Saturday in August.

Special meetings shall be called by the President, or by request of a majority of the members, for the transaction only of business stated in the call.

ARTICLE VI. This constitution and by-laws may be amended at any annual meeting by a two-third vote of the members of the Association, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting, and notice is included in the call for the meeting.

BY-LAWS

I. A majority of the members of the Association and of the members of any standing committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

II. *Committees.* At the annual

meeting the President shall appoint standing committees as follows: A committee of three members on Finance, a committee of three members on Publicity and co-operation, a committee of three members on Ways and means, and a committee of three members on Books and administration.

The committee on finance shall have charge of all Association finances and examine and report upon all bills against the board.

The committee on publicity and co-operation shall have general charge of advertising in the newspapers, shall enlist the co-operation of local organizations, and shall formulate and carry out plans for the extension of the use and advantages of the library.

The committee on ways and means shall recommend a location for the library, and shall have charge of the rooms, and their heating, lighting, and care.

The committee on books and administration shall supervise the selection, buying, exchange, and binding of books and periodicals, and have general supervision of the library and reading room. It shall pass upon all books presented to the Association before their acceptance.

III. *Librarian.* The librarian shall be elected by a majority vote of the Association upon recommendation of the committee on books and administration. She shall have charge of the library and reading-room and be responsible for the care of the books and other library property; promptly report any delinquencies to the committee on books and administration; keep exact account of all moneys received from fines and other sources and report the accounts to the board at its regular meetings and pay all balances to the secretary at the designated meetings; and discharge such other duties as may be prescribed by the board; *provided*, that in the performance of her duties she shall not incur debt or liability of any kind without express authority from the board.

IV. The order of business at regular meetings of the Association shall be:

1. Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting (and their approval.)
2. Reports of standing committees.
3. Reports of special committees.
4. Report of librarian.
5. Unfinished business.
6. New business.
