Salem And Airlie To Have Fast Service.

SALEM, Or., Feb. 19.—Announcement has been made by Herman Hirschberg, president of the Independence, Monmouth & Airlie Railroad Company, that he will install a service by March 1 between all points on his line and West Salem. The car secured for the service is almost a duplicate of the motor now in operation on the Salem, Falls City & Western. Before the service can be installed, he will have to construct a turntable at Independence. The plan is to run a motor from Independence to Airlie in the morning and then back to West Salem by 9 o'clock in the morning and back to Monmouth by noon. There will also be an afternoon service. Close connections will be made with trains on the West Side division.
