Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that the Common Council of the city of Monmouth, Polk County, Oregon, has appointed L. H. Treat, B. F. Baker and C. E. Force to view out and assess damages and benefits to property owners effected by the widening of Jackson street, between Knox and Ecols streets, to make said part of Jackson street conform with the rest of said Jackson street, the properties effected being as follows; to-wit:
