Montana Rainfall Breaks All Records Since State Was Settled.

BUTTE, MONT., Aug. 20.—A cloudburst, followed by the heaviest downpour of rain in the history of Montana, occurred late Sunday and early yesterday. As a result all train schedules have been abandoned, washouts on every Eastern Montana line rendering regular service impossible. Wednesday is believed to be the first date when regular service can be resumed. At Glendive a rainfall of four inches in 12 hours flooded basements and caused heavy damage. Similar conditions are reported from other Eastern Montana towns.

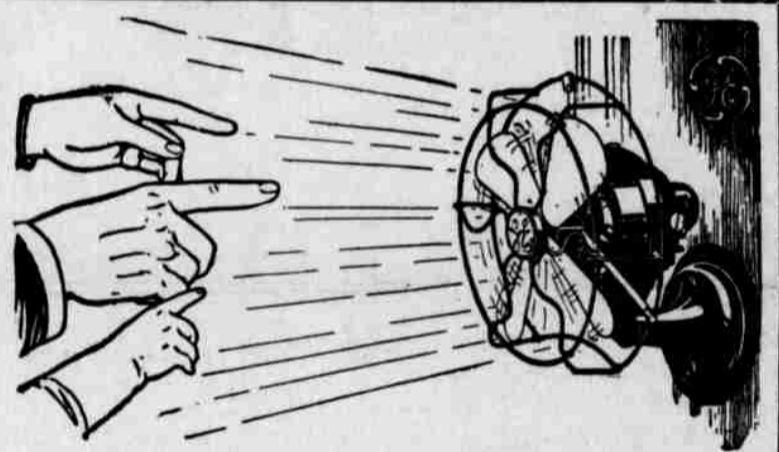
