FALLS CITY, Or., May 12.—Fire greatly damaged the Mahr general merchandise stock Saturday night, as well as the building, which is owned by G. Sowers. The fire was discovered at 9 o'clock and in a few minutes

ORDINANCE No. 163.

An ordinance to amend section 3, of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance prescribing the material to be used, and the manner and method of construction to be observed in the building of certain side-walks within the corporate limits of the City of Monmouth, Oregon; providing further for the building and maintenance of uniform curb lines within said city; for specific authority for repairing and building side-walks and curb lines, and for penalties for violation of the terms of this ordinance and matters kindred thereto; and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof," passed by the common council of the City of Monmouth, on the 2nd day of July, 1912, and approved by the mayor of said city on the 2nd day of July, 1912.

The City of Monmouth Does Ordain—

Section 1. That section 3 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance prescribing the material to be used, and the manner and method of construction to be observed in the building of certain side-walks within the corporate limits of the City of Monmouth, Oregon; providing further for the building and maintenance of uniform curb lines within said city; for specific authority for repairing and building side-walks and curb lines, and for penalties for viola-

tion of the terms of this ordinance and matters kindred thereto; and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof," passed by the common council of the City of Monmouth, Oregon, on the 2nd day of July 1912; and approved by the mayor on the 2nd day of July, 1912, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Every person, firm, company or corporation desiring to construct a side-walk, or curb, or both, shall before entering upon said work and improvement, apply for a permit to so build and improve to the Street Committee of the City of Monmouth, and shall state to said committee, in explicit terms, the character of the side-walk or curb, or both, intended to be built, the location by lot and block numbers, and by street, the material to be used, and the dimensions to be employed in said work, and if in the opinion of the Street Committee, the intended improvement does not conflict with the terms of this ordinance, then it shall be the duty of said street committee to furnish said applicant, without cost or charge, a written permit to so build and improve in accordance with the location, material, distance, and dimensions asked for. In case of refusal by said street committee to furnish said applicant with a permit as herein provided for, the said applicant shall have the right of appeal to the common council for relief, and the common council shall hear and decide the matter at issue, and make an order ratifying the act of the street committee, or enforce the issuance of said permit and cause the order so made to be entered upon the journal of the proceedings of said common council for the session at which said hearing and decision was had and made; provided however, that a permit issued as above provided for shall be good for a period of 30 days from the date of issuance of the same, at the expiration of which time, the same shall become null and void, and the common council of said city may proceed in the premises as though no permit had ever been issued.

Passed by the common council on the 13th day of May, 1913.
