### Vapor Tube For Illumination

Illumination experts are hard at work in the electrical laboratories at Schenectady, New York, experimenting to produce novel lighting devices for the Panama-Pacific International Exposition. Several original lighting appliances have been devised and these are being perfected in the laboratories.

When developed these devices will add greater enchantment to the brilliant illumination of the exposition and will contribute much to the magnificence and beauty of the palaces and courts.

One of these is a vapor tube which will be used to illuminate the cascades in the Court of Abundance. These tubes will be placed beneath the water and when vari-colored lights are produced in them, their delicate shades will glow through the seething waterfalls, throwing dainty shadows over the vines and evergreens along the cascades.

Another striking illumination feature being perfected will be used for the Palace of Horticulture and will make this huge palace a scene of grandeur and splendor. A battery of searchlights will be placed beneath the large dome of this building and their rays will be made to pass through a revolving screen of various colors. This will throw great shafts of colored light about the dome, illuminating the entire palace as well.

A plan for lighting the Court of the Sun and Stars with electric fountains also is being developed together with many other novel features.
