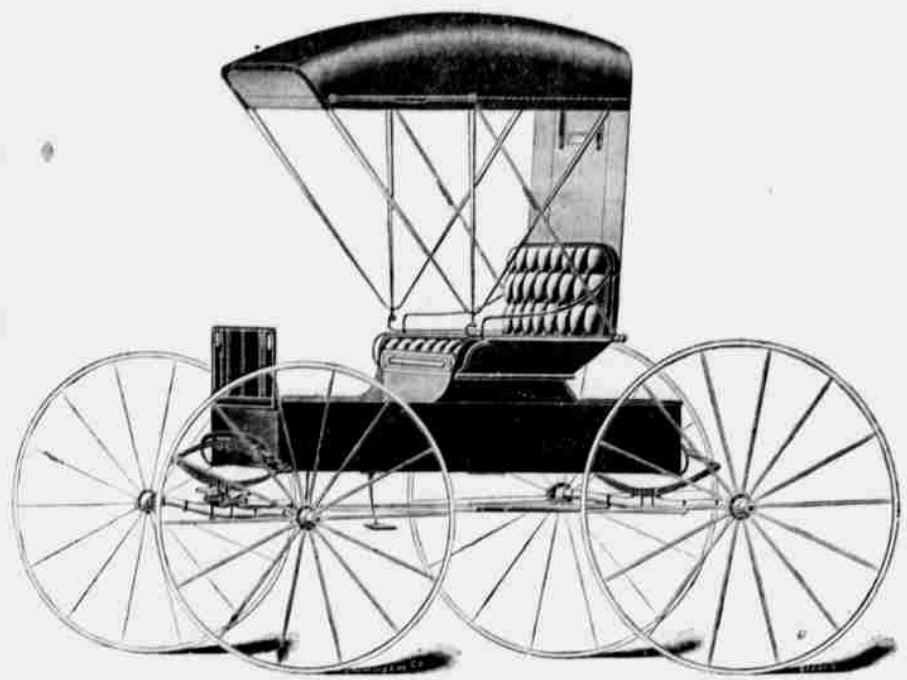

Fishermen Notice

Salem, Ore., Apr. 11, 1914
Mr. Edward Griffla,

Dear Sir: Replying to your letter of the 5th instant relative to the use of salmon spawn for angling, beg to advise you that it is unlawful to use salmon spawn for the purpose of angling in the Willamette River south of East Independence, or any of its tributaries. This law refers, of course, to tributaries on the east and west side of the Willamette River, as well as at points across the river opposite East Independence Station.

Under separate cover, we are forwarding you a copy of the Fish and Game Laws, and at Page 36, Section 40, you will find this law set forth.
