SALOONS MUST GO

The following paragraph, from the Toledo Blade, Ohio, was written in the interest of the prohibition campaign in that state, but is quite as appropriate for the State of Oregon:

There never has been nor can there ever be any sound argument in favor of the liquor traffic. Every consideration of morality and justice and efficiency, of individual happiness and of national progress, demands the destruction of the constant lure and the eternal menace of the saloon.
