

Forest Notes

News prior paper has been made by the Forest Service laboratory from 24 different woods and a number compare favorably with standard spruce pulp paper.

The Forest Service is co-operating with 54 railroads, mining companies, and cities in making tests of wooden ties, timbers, poles, piling, and paving blocks which have been given preservative treatments.

In 1895 there were 15 wood preserving plants operating in the United States; in 1914 the number had increased to 122, representing all types of plant.

The 1914 figures, based upon reports from 94 plants, show that the total number of cubic feet of material treated with preservatives was 159,582,639 cubic feet. This was an increase of 5,968,751 cubic feet over the total for 1913. Of this increase, 103,980 cubic feet was made up of piling, and 3,577,571 more cross ties were handled than during the previous year.

During 1914, nearly eighty million gallons of creosote were used by the preserving plants of the United States.

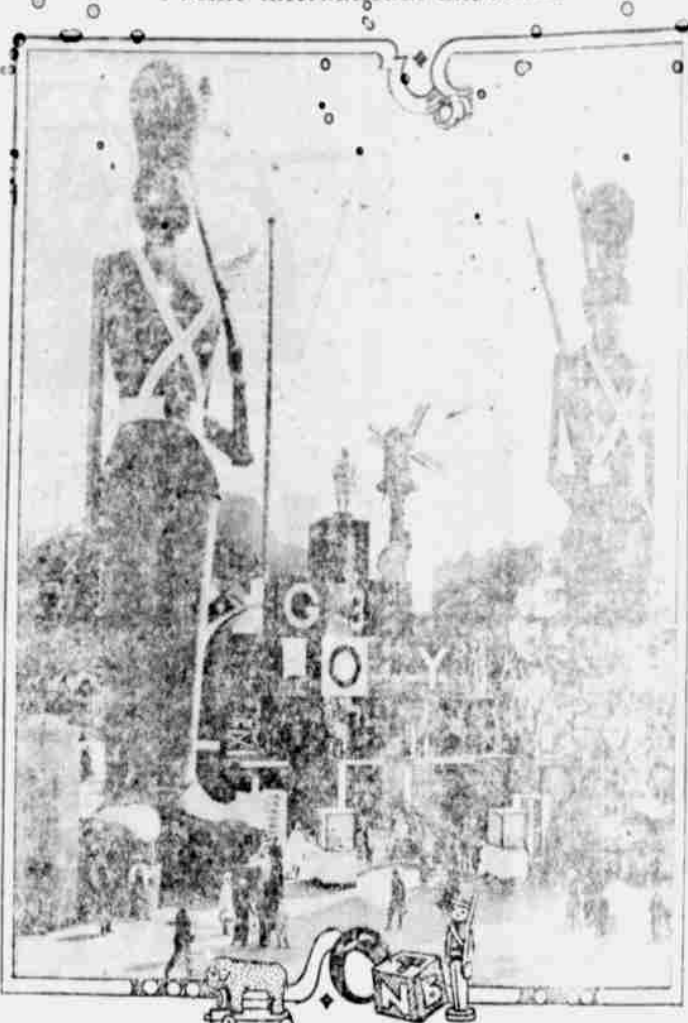
