Prof. J. B. V. Butler of the Normal school was one of the speakers on the program at the all-day rally at Airlie last Saturday.

At the annual meeting of the Fruit Growers Association of Polk County the old officers were re-elected. M. M. Harvey of Monmouth was elected as a member of the executive board.

Arthur Burkhead has been on the sick list the past week, having throat trouble, and Harry Brookhart, one of the Normal students, has been filling his place in the West Salem school.

In the stock-judging contest at the Oregon Agricultural College the Polk County school boys captured every award but one, that being fifth place. First, fifth and ninth places in the pig judging were also taken by them.
