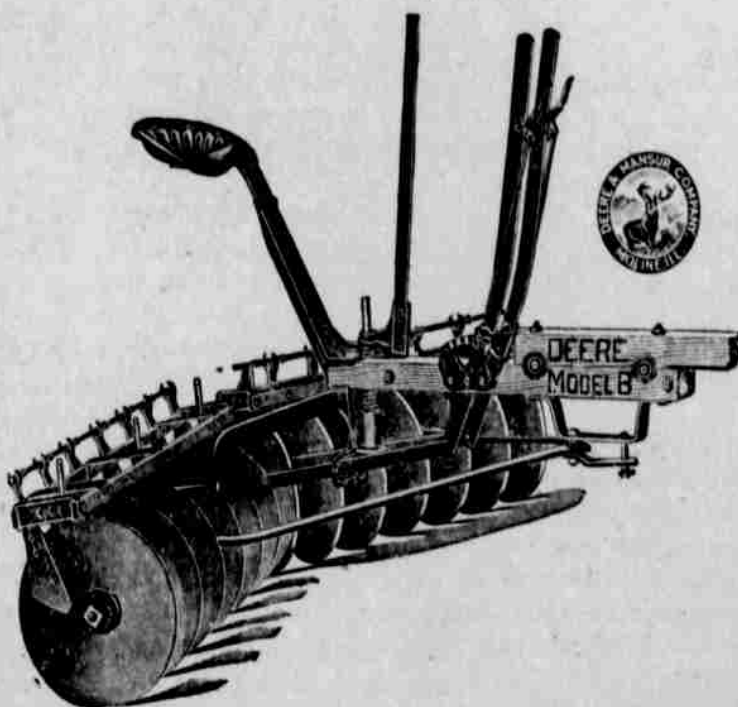

The Independence & Monmouth railroad, owned and operated by Joe Hirschberg, has joined with the Western Association of Short Lines in an effort to obtain increased pay and improved conditions for the carrying of mails, the situation having become acute with the rapid growth of parcel post mail. Nine Oregon railroads are interested in the movement, and ask that the entire control of rates for carrying the mail be placed with the interstate commerce commission, and that the mail be weighed annually as a basis of payment.—Dallas Observer.
