It appears that Game Warden Shoemaker of Roseburg does not keep posted on all rulings of the state commission relative to open waters. He recently issued a statement to the effect that the embargo was not yet lifted from the waters of Polk county and

that anglers must not seek for fish therein until given due permission. But the permission had already been given and the state commission had ruled to the effect that the waters were free after April 1st to any fisher with an angler's license. Mr. Shoemaker's excuse for not hearing of this sooner was that he had been sick and in the hospital at the time the order was issued.
