Foot-and-Mouth in the Philippines.

Officials of the Philippines reported to Washington last week that the foot-and-mouth disease has again laid its grip on the islands. The scourge is called rinderpest over there, and has been the bugbear of all cattle dealers and dairies, the few that there are, almost from the beginning of American occupation in 1898.

It is estimated that 260,000 carabaos have died of rinderpest in the last year. There were 500 deaths in the last week of April, when the last mail report was sent to Washington. The loss is about \$5,000,000.

The Philippine bureau of agriculture asked for \$250,000 to fight the scourge, but the legislature only appropriated \$12,500 and this is held responsible to a great extent for the spread of the disease.

If conditions continue as they are in the islands it is feared that the loss the coming year will be fully as great.
