Sidewalks occupied a conspicuous position in the deliberations of the common council at its regular meeting Tuesday night. Mayor, recorder, marshal and all councilmen except Lorence were present when the roll was called and the latter appeared later in the evening.

The recorder submitted proof of having posted Ordinance 186 and the same was accepted.

Resolution 210 was taken up expressing the intention of the city to assess the cost of building sidewalks abutting the property of Grace A. Quisenberry, A. B. Westfall, Chas. C. Lewis, E. D. Ressler, Mary A. Stine, Etta Dornsife, School Dist. 13, Cassie B. Stump, Orville Butler, the Evangelical Association and Alice Canning. Resolution was adopted.

A motion also prevailed to purchase the necessary supplies to move the three fire hydrants located within the proposed paving.
