NOTICE OF SCHOOL MEETING

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. 13 of Polk County, State of Oregon, that a School Meeting of said District will be held at High School Building on the 25th day of November, 1916, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax.

The total amount of money needed by the district during the fiscal year beginning on June 19th, 1916, and ending on June 20th, 1917, is estimated in the following budget and includes the amounts to be received from the county school fund, state school fund, special district tax, and all other moneys of the district:
