Mr. T. J. Alsip is going to put out one thousand prune trees.

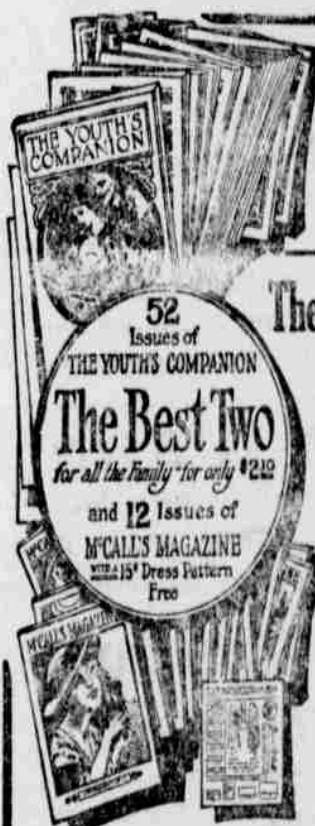
Mr. L. I. Bursell and Mr. Niggli are also putting out trees.
