Quarantine Restrictions

Owing to the prevalence of
contagious diseases it has been
thought wise to publish a synop-
sis of the Oregon quarantine
laws:

For Smallpox the period of
quarantine is 21 days from the
beginning of the disease and 14
days to anyone who has been ex-
posed.

For Scarlet Fever the period
of quarantine is not less than 30
days and isolation of the patient
and children associated with the
patient for 10 days after the re-
moval of quarantine. Patient
can not enter school for 21 days
after quarantine is lifted. Other
children in the family may be
isolated in another house for 10
days, disinfected and permitted
to attend school.

Diphtheria, the period of quar-
antine is not less than 14 days.
Clothing and premises must be
disinfected when quarantine is
lifted. Other children in the
house may be released after re-
ceiving anti-toxin and disinfection.
Adult members of family
may be released by having them-
selves and clothing disinfected.

For mumps, the patient only
is isolated and quarantined.

For measles, patient must be
quarantined for at least 14 days
and patient must not attend
school for 5 days after quaran-
tine is raised. Persons who have
had measles are not subject to
quarantine and may attend any
public gathering or mingle with
other children.
