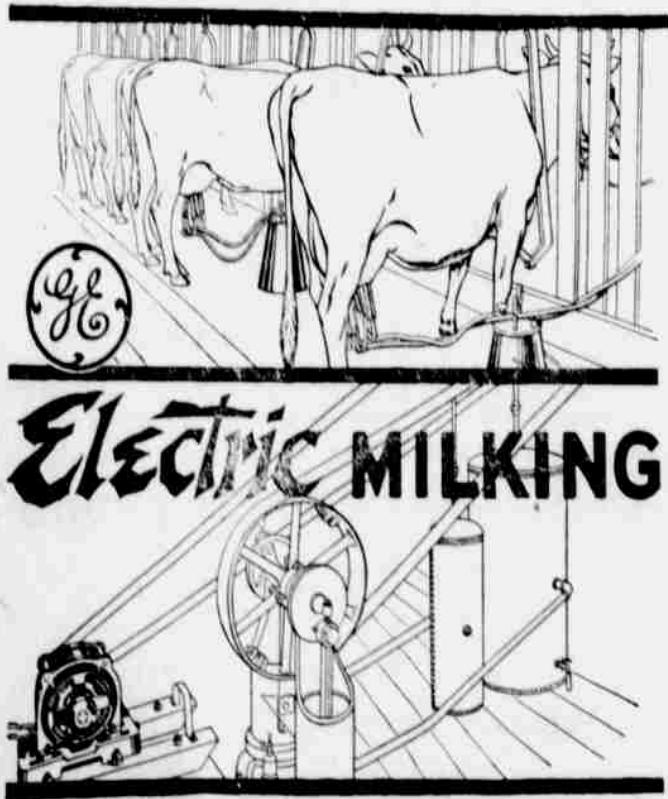
N. E. Foster left for Newberg Thursday afternoon on receipt of a telegram stating that his mother, Mrs. W. A. Foster was very low with pneumonia.
