Rev. H. Schuknecht of Portland, Presiding Elder of the District, will preach Saturday evening at 8 o'clock.

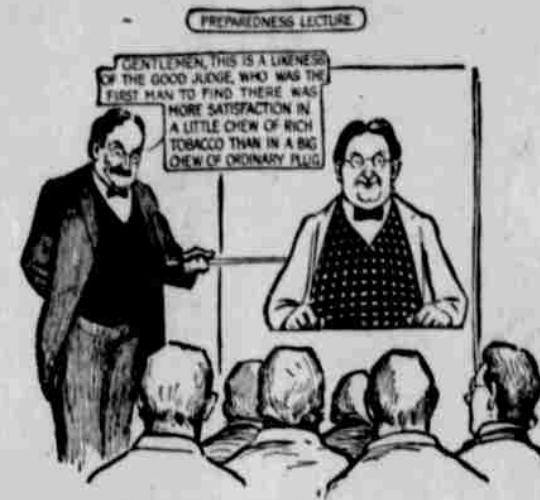
