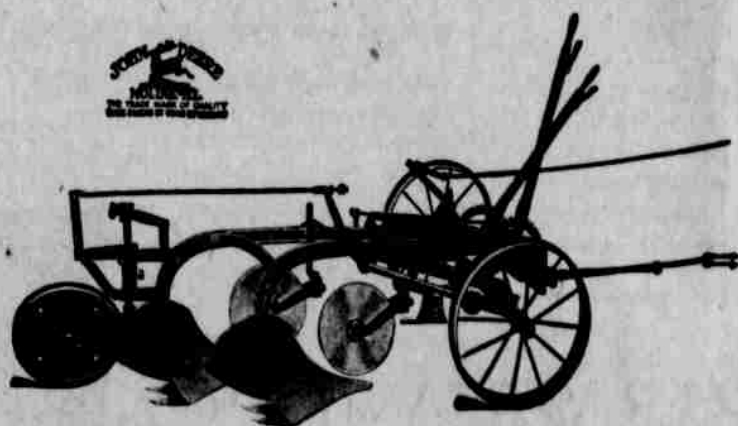


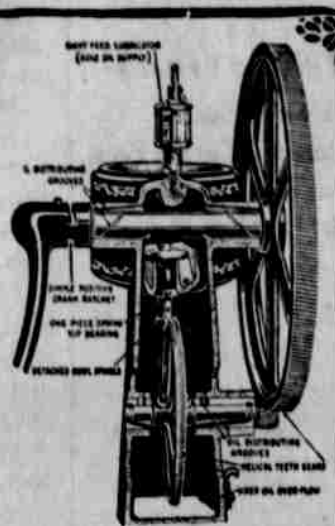

Summons, to-wit:—on or before the 17th day of November, 1917, and if you fail so to appear and answer, for want thereof the Plaintiff will apply to said Court for the relief in said complaint demanded, to-wit:—For a judgement against said defendants in the sum of \$2768.99, with interest thereon from August 22nd, 1917, at the rate of 8 per cent per annum until paid; for the sum of \$100.00 attorney's fees and for its costs and disbursements of said suit. That the usual decree in foreclosure may be made for the sale of the premises in said complaint described, to-wit:—Beginning at a point 57.58 chains West and 13.68 chains South of the Northwest corner of the Joseph Carmack D. L. C. in Township 8, S. R. 5, West of Will. Mer. in Polk County Oregon, at a stone set for the S. W. corner of the land formerly owned by J. M.
