No Peace in Sight

No peace will be made with the Hun gophers and moles in Polk County until they are completely exterminated, states the County agent. Even though the Kaiser and Crown Prince of the rodent tribes surrender unconditionally, they will be given no quarter and no mercy will be shown.

Next week beginning Monday, November 11, rain or shine, the war will be resumed and fought to a finish.

Boys are wanted for the campaign as well as men. Dig up the old mole and gopher traps, sling them over your shoulder and march to the front. Come to the following recruiting stations mentioned below, where the latest methods in modern rodent warfare will be shown by Mr. Scheffer of the Bureau of Biological Survey. Do not forget these dates.

Monday, November 11, 10:30, Zena School; 2:30 Brush College;

Tuesday, November 12, 10:30, Airlie School; 2:30, Buena Vista School;

Wednesday, November 13, 10:30, Falls City School; 2:30, Guthrie School;

Thursday, November 14, 10:30 Buell School; 2:30 Perrydale School;

Friday, November 16, 10:30, Eola School; 2:30, Monmouth School.

Arrangements have been made by the county agent to sell the entire output of mole skins secured during the campaign to a Portland fur company; as a mole skin will bring from 15 to 35 cents each, it is expected that a large number of moles will be killed this fall and winter.

In order to secure as large a killing as possible, cash prizes will be given to the boys who secure the largest number of gopher scalps during the war. The county has been divided into a number of districts and a first, second and third

prize will be given in each zone, thus giving an even chance for the boys in the entire county. Further details concerning the awarding of this prize money will be given at the demonstrations.

Some people say that gophers cannot be successfully poisoned. Possibly that is true in other counties, but in Polk County, they can. And in fact, poisoning of these pests is the chief method of extermination advocated by the Bureau of Biological Survey. Farmers can poison ten gophers where they trap one, states an authority on rodent work. Trapping is very good as far as it goes, but poisoning if conducted along the lines laid down by the government experts will do far more towards exterminating pocket gophers.

But there are several things about gopher poisoning not generally known. One of the objects of the demonstrations which will be conducted through the county during next week will be to show some of these methods.

The treasury department is to issue and sell war savings stamps all through next year. A new series of 1919 has been issued and the restriction of \$1,000 purchase to each person has been amended to allow

\$1,000 to be purchased each year of the year's issue.

Word has been received that H. E. Gregory, County Agricultural Agent has been appointed Agricultural Advisor to the District Exemption Board of Division No. 2 of this state, acting for the War Department. Mr. Gregory will assist the Local Board in examining questionnaires of registrants engaged in agricultural production who are asking for deferred classification on the ground of their agricultural occupation, and will inform the District Board concerning the labor conditions on the farms in the county as they are affected by the operation of the new draft law.

Lime applied this fall should produce effects on next year's crop. In prune orchards where the soil is depleted, or difficulty is experienced in starting cover crops, lime should be applied to correct acidity if present. The sooner it is done, that much time will be saved in putting back the necessary plant food in the soil in the form of humus furnished by the cover crop.
