Summons

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Polk County.

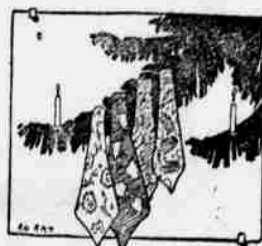
