

FED HIS CHILDREN GARBAGE

New York Father Is Charged With Gross Negligence of His Family.

New York.—John Peraldo, a Swiss, residing near Inwood, a suburb of this city, has been adjudged guilty in the court of special sessions, sitting in New York city, of what was called most horrible neglect of the duties of husband and father.

Peraldo, thirty-five years old, had been in the United States 12 years. His accusers in court were his wife, several neighbors and agents of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children. During the testimony it was shown that his wife and three children, Linda, six years old; Edith, three, and Joseph, eleven months, were housed in a tumble-down shack which they shared with chickens, dogs and a pig.

It was found that Peraldo does odd jobs for apartment house tenants in New York, and that each day he selected from garbage he brought home the food for his wife and children before feeding the pig, dogs and chickens. Peraldo himself lived in a coop in the back yard.

Asleep With Mouth Open, Woman Swallowed Mouse

OUT OF THE ORDINARY.

The common fruits of mother earth if served in ways a little out of the ordinary may become dishes that seem to be extraordinary.

All vegetables should be put to cook in boiling water, but cooks differ as to time for adding salt.

The majority, however, agree that tender succulent vegetables should be salted just before serving; root vegetables may be salted during the cooking.

Turnips may be hollowed out in the form of cups, cooked until tender and the cups filled with creamed peas, diced carrots, creamed celery or other vegetables well liked.

Carrots With Lemon Butter.—Cook carrots cut with a vegetable shredder, until tender, in a very little water; let them steam on the back of the stove and dry out, add salt, nutmeg and a dash of cayenne with a tablespoonful or less of lemon juice. Serve hot.

Beet cups prepared in the same way the turnip cups were and filled with the tiny string beans which have been cooked in bacon fat, vinegar and shredded onion and all served hot makes a most tasty and pleasing dish.

Cooked chopped beets served with French dressing is a dish greatly liked.

When serving corn in a thin white sauce add an egg or two for richness and have a much more nourishing dish and one not common.

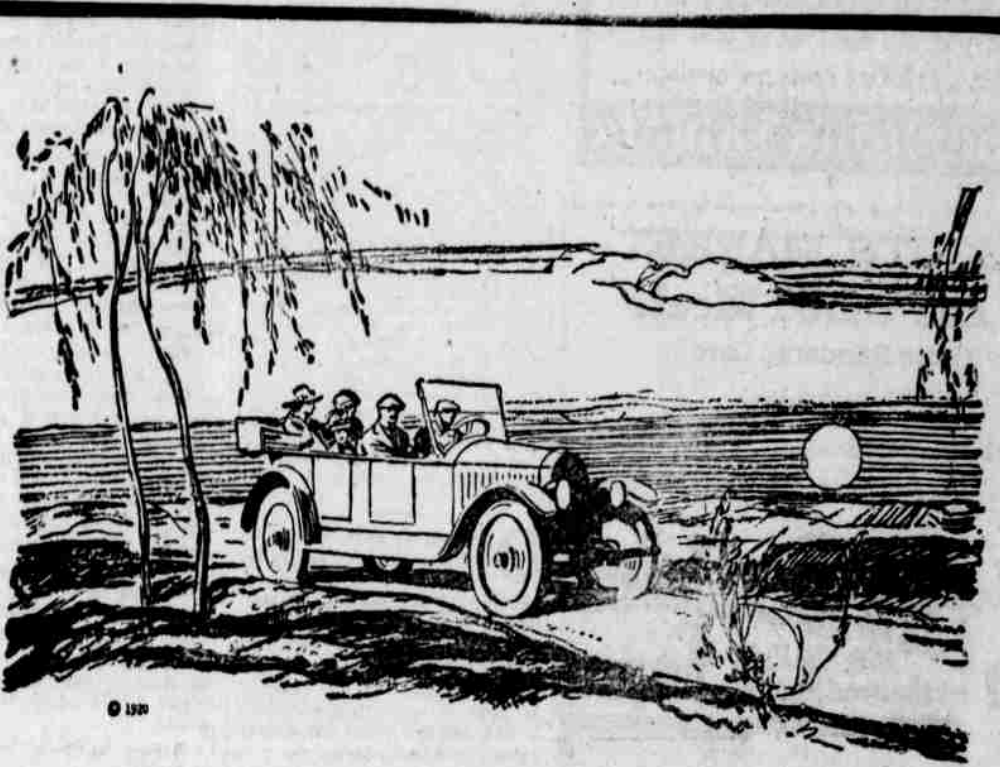
