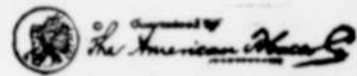

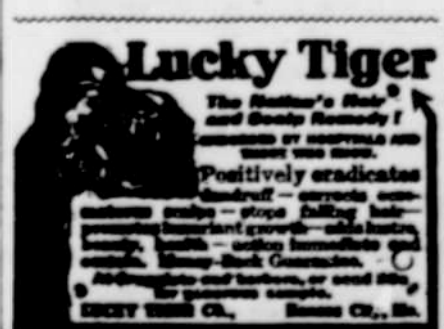
The points are scored for individual and relay events alike on the basis of 5 points for firsts, 3 points for seconds, 2 points for thirds and 1 point for fourths.
