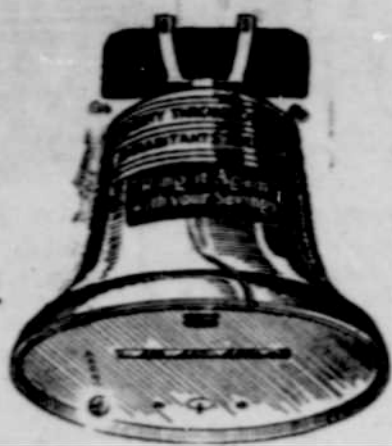

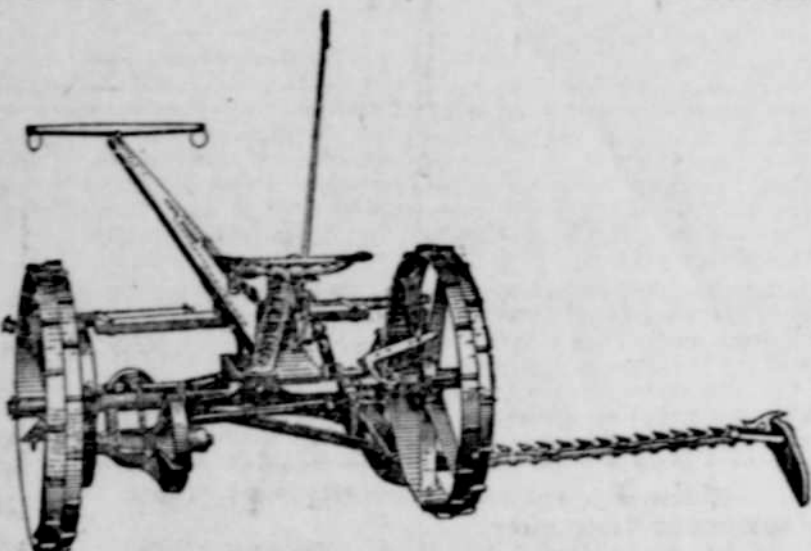

Monmouth Meditations

Now that the highway dispute is settled there seems no practical reason why the different sections of Polk county should longer persist in the rather questionable pastime of making faces at one another. Monmouth and Independence, especially, have a great many interests in common and a little team work would achieve wonders.

The name of P. O. Powell as a candidate for Master of the State Grange, should the present Master, C. S. Spence, resign, is being considered in different parts of the state among Grangers. Mr. Powell is one of the fairest men that ever lived, and one of the most public spirited. His wide knowledge of agriculture, his acquaintance in the state, his life-long experience would make him a capable and valuable head for the State Grange.

Professor Edwin T. Reed, O. A. C. college editor, who will address the class to be graduated from Monmouth high school June 8, is a poet, teacher, and composer of songs.

Born at River Falls, Wis., Professor Reed spent his boyhood days there and attended common and high school. Swimming and walking tight rope in juvenile circuses were his favorite sports.

In 1896 he received his A. B. degree at the University of Minnesota. Newspaper work next attracted him but he remained at this for only a short time for the position of superintendent of the city schools at Rushford, Minn. was offered him. For three years he remained there and then spent a year as superintendent at Cloquet.

Professor Reed took charge of the English department at the Minnesota Normal school in 1901 and remained there for 11 years. In 1912 he came to O. A. C. as college editor, after teaching for a time at the University of Minnesota.

In 1898 he began his career as a poet when he published a book of verse, "Indian Windfalls". In 1900 his second book of "Lyrics" was written and published. He has written many college and popular songs. Several books and bulletins have been written by him and he contributes verse and prose to several magazines. Professor Reed has charge of editing and issuing all official publications of the college.

principles, among them, universal suffrage, freedom of speech, and religious liberty, all of which were experimental.

When the deliberations of the constitutional convention were about concluded he said that Franklin arose and calling attention to the picture of a sunrise over the president's chair, said there was always some doubt in looking at such a picture. The artist found it difficult in color and shade to differentiate between a rising and a setting sun. During the deliberations of the convention he had been in doubt as to which end of the day this particular sun represented. Now he felt positive that it was a rising sun and he held it a happy augury.
