In last week's Enterprise we noticed an item about Mr. Patterson's corn crop. The record of planting corn by the Oak Point School for the past 5 years is as follows: May 10, 1919; May 5, 1920; April 26, 1921; April 22, 1922; April 18, 1923. We have found that the earlier the planting the better as the corn is well on its way before the dry weather comes on, and matures perfectly before the fall rains set in. Last year's corn gave a 99 per cent test. This corn planted April 18 is growing rapidly and vigorously and the field presents a pleasing appearance.

Beginning at a point 726 feet south 21 degrees and 30 minutes East of the Northeast corner of Block 14 in the City of Monmouth, on the west side of Monmouth avenue; thence south 68 degrees and 30 minutes, west 726 feet to east side of Whitman street, crossing College street at 330 feet; thence south 21 degrees and 30 minutes, east 66 feet along east side of said Whitman street to a station on said side; thence north 68 degrees and 30 minutes, east 726 feet to the west side of Monmouth avenue, crossing College street at 330 feet; thence along the west side of Monmouth avenue north 21 degrees 30 minutes west 66 feet to the place of beginning;

That the north half of said proposed street as above described, between Monmouth avenue and College street, will be taken and appropriated from the said premises of T. J. and Mary Fryer, which premises are described as follows, to-wit:—Beginning at a point 27 feet E. and 15 rods, 12 feet and three inches S. of the southeast corner of block 14 in the City of Monmouth, Polk County, Oregon; running thence west 5.93 chains, thence south 2.40 chains, thence east 5.93 chains, thence north 2.40 chains to place of beginning, containing 1.43 acres, more or less, and being a part of the D. L. C. of S. S. Whitman No. 70 in T. 8 S. R. 5 W. of Willamette Meridian in said county and state.

That the south half of said proposed street as above described, between Monmouth avenue and College street, will be taken and appropriated from said premises of W. E. Smith, which premises are described as follows, to-wit:—Beginning 41 feet and 3 inches east and 26 rods south of the southeast corner of block 14 in the City of Monmouth, Polk County, Oregon; thence 2.04 chains south, thence west 6.13 chains, thence north 2.04 chains, thence east 6.13 chains to place of beginning, containing 1.25 acres, in said D. L. C. in said county and state.

That the west part of said proposed street from College to Whitman streets, will be taken and appropriated from the premises of said Mollie B. Stump, which premises are described as follows, to-wit:—

South of Block 13 in said Town of Monmouth, Beginning at a point which is 9.50 chains south and 70 links west of Monument No. three (3) situate at the southwest corner of block 11 in said City of Monmouth, and running thence south 3.50 chains, thence west 5.30 chains, to east line of Whitman street, thence north 3.50 chains, thence east 5.30 chains to place of beginning, containing 1.85 acres more or less.

Notice is further given that all persons claiming damages by reason of the appropriation of said property for said street, shall file their claims for such damages with the city recorder of said city prior to June 2, 1923, such being the time appointed as aforesaid for the meeting of said viewers.
