DALLAS POWER PLANT LEASED TO LUMBER CO.

The Willamette Valley Lumber company has leased for an extended number of years the power plant of the Mountain States Power company in Dallas and will hereafter operate it at their own expense and manufacture their own juice. This deal has been in the offing for some time, but it was only this week that it was finally consummated. The lumber company will take possession of the plant on August 1.

Heretofore the lumber company has been working on an exchange basis with the power company, the mill furnishing the fuel in exchange for their operating juice. The exchange has C. E. Under the new lease the present working force in the power plant will be somewhat decreased, both the day and night shift.
