STREETS NO PLACE FOR VAUDEVILLE STUNTS

Robert McPhearson of Portland, who with another young man and a couple of young women from the same town motored to Corvallis to "show off" Sunday, has reached the conclusion that the business streets of Corvallis were not made for vaudeville shows. McPhearson was driving up and down the streets at a rapid rate of speed and showing his associates how quickly he could turn the corners without turning the car over, when an officer extended an invitation to the driver to accompany him to the city bastille, which he did. It didn't look good inside to McPhearson and he managed to scrape up \$10 to guarantee his appearance in court Monday morning. He did not appear, however, and Judge Conner declared the bail forfeited.—Corvallis Courier.

DALLAS POWER PLANT LEASED TO LUMBER CO.

The Willamette Valley Lumber company has leased for an extended number of years the power plant of the Mountain States Power company in Dallas and will hereafter operate it at their own expense and manufacture their own juice. This deal has been in the offing for some time, but it was only this week that it was finally consummated. The lumber company will take possession of the plant on August 1.

Heretofore the lumber company has been working on an exchange basis with the power company, the mill furnishing the fuel in exchange for their operating juice. The exchange has not always been satisfactory to the milling company as they were required by their contract to furnish fuel even while not in operation in order that juice could be furnished to the regular patrons of the power company.

Under the new lease the present working force in the power plant will be somewhat decreased, both the day and night shift. Under the contract lease the milling company will be required to maintain and operate the plant so that in case of line trouble with the power company the latter could utilize the plant as an auxiliary. The taking of possession by the lumber company will necessitate the laying of a six-inch steam pipe from the power plant to the mill. Work of laying and connecting this pipe line is now under way.

After August 1 all the power furnished in the Dallas district, which includes Monmouth, Independence and Dallas, will come from the Prospect plant of the Mountain States Power company over their new 66,000 volt transmission line. By this means all the power that is desired for the Dallas district can be secured.—Observer.
