Farmer's Cruelty Attracts Attention

miles south of Corvallis, attracted considerable attention when his cruelty to animals intensely aroused human sympathy. Hubbard undertook to lead two colts behind a load of farm equipment drawn by a team of horses, and to prevent them from pulling back he fastened a rope around the hind flanks of each animal and attached it to the wagon. The rope had torn the flesh on both animals and the younger was nearly exhausted when he reached Corvallis. Officers took the matter in hand and Hubbard was commanded to leave the colts in a barn here until they were able to travel. Persons who observed the condition of the horses claim that it is fortunate for Hubbard that there is no humane officer in Corvallis, but that fact does not add to the comfort of the horses nor does it afford an excuse for such inhuman treatment to animals.—Benton County Courier.

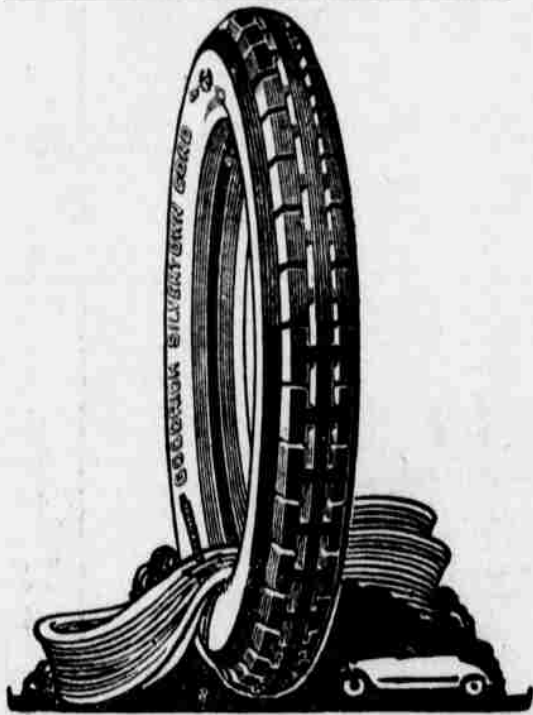
