How to Make Cement

Something which the suburbanite frequently needs in small quantities, but which he rarely has on hand, is a good, quick setting cement for uniting small fragments of iron, setting wooden handles into tools and a hundred and one other small jobs. A very good cement which will answer almost any requirement may be made by dissolving common orange shellac in enough alcohol to form a paste. This may be kept on hand in a tightly corked bottle with a wide mouth, tightly corked, or the alcohol will evaporate. When it is desired to use the cement place as much as is desired to use in any small tin vessel and set the paste on fire. The alcohol will soon burn out, and the cement should then be quickly used before it has time to cool. The cement is very strong and is waterproof.

The goats have endured the winter very well, considering the attention they have received from their neglectful owners.

The goats are low in value at present, but if their keepers will give them good care they will bring good returns just the same.

Now is the time to do your best breeding. The prices for bucks are somewhat reduced and the demand for breeding stock is slow, but that gives those who want to stay in the goat business a better chance to get the choice of the valley to bring his own

flock nearer in quality and value to the best in the county or state.

Now is the time for us small breeders to go several steps up the ladder while most other men are saying the "goats are so cheap there is nothing in them, and I am going to dispose of mine"; and so on the valley over you can hear this. But there is little wonder there isn't much profit in goat raising for some parties who furnish nothing for goats to make themselves profitable on. Old catout brush patches old muddy sheds and wheat straw for winter feed and they will say their goats only sheared 2½ pounds, when if they had been given a good dry shed and some cat hay, they would have brought paying returns to their keepers.

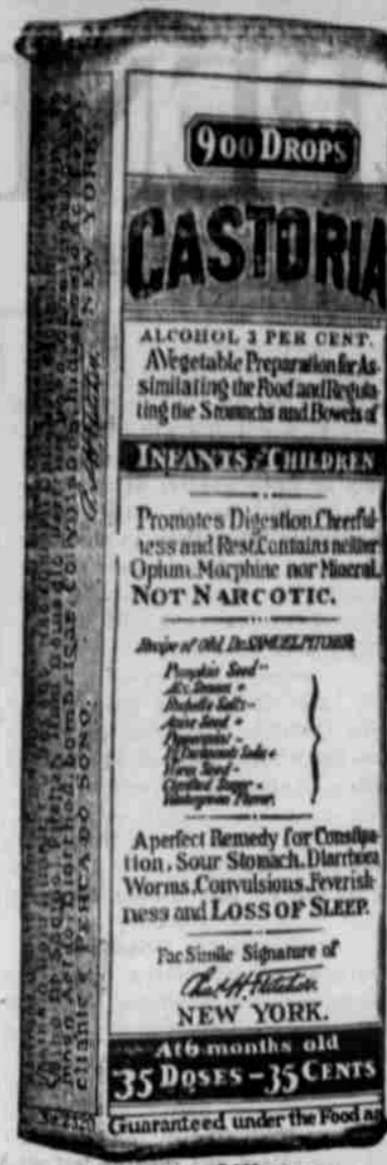
