CASTRO MAY SUE FRANCE

Reported to Be Consulting With Lawyers Regarding Expulsion.

Paris, May 3.—Cipriano Castro, ex-President of Venezuela, is reported to be consulting with lawyers here with a view to bringing a damage suit against the French government for his recent expulsion from Martinique.

As the government has the power to expel foreigners at its discretion, Senor Castro, it is said, purposes basing his action on the fact that he was forcibly placed aboard a ship at Martinique and compelled to return to France without being given the option of his destination.

Fair Buildings Will Be Ready.

Seattle, May 4.—One month before the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition opens the buildings are practically ready. Where finishing work is done the task of placing exhibits is going on, so that May 15 will see the show almost ready to open. Henry E. Dorsch, director of exhibits states that his department would have everything in readiness before June 1. A strong program has been arranged for the opening day and the succeeding days of the first week. Children's day will be the Saturday following the opening.

THREATENS OREGON JUDGE

Assassination Warning Follows Conviction of Man at Tillamook.

Tillamook, Or., May 4.—Quite a sensation was caused when Judge Gallaway took his seat on the bench Monday morning and made the statement he had been informed by a reliable citizen that his life had been threatened, and that he was not to live to pass sentence upon a certain defendant who had been found guilty at this term of the circuit court. It is generally thought it is some boot-legger who has been making the alleged threats.

FIRST PRESIDENT OF REPUBLIC OF PANAMA IS DEAD

Panama, May 3.—Dr. Samuel Amador, first president of the Republic of Panama, died Sunday after a lingering illness, aged 75 years.

Manuel Amador was one of the prime movers in the revolution in 1903 against Colombia, which led to the independence of Panama.

Celebrate Dewey's Day.

Washington, May 1.—Admiral George Dewey and a number of naval officers who sailed with him into Manila Bay on May 1, 1898, celebrated at a banquet tonight the 11th anniversary of that memorable victory. Nineteen covers were laid.

New York, May 2.—A verdict of guilty of criminal libel was found against the publishers of the New York American by the jury in the trial charging the publication of an article libeling John D. Rockefeller.
