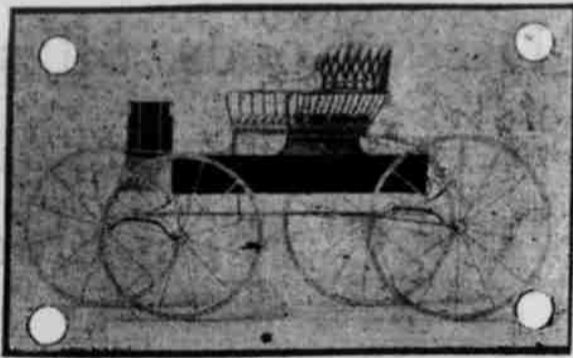

The people of Harmony met at J. B. Hayes Sunday evening spending a delightful evening singing.

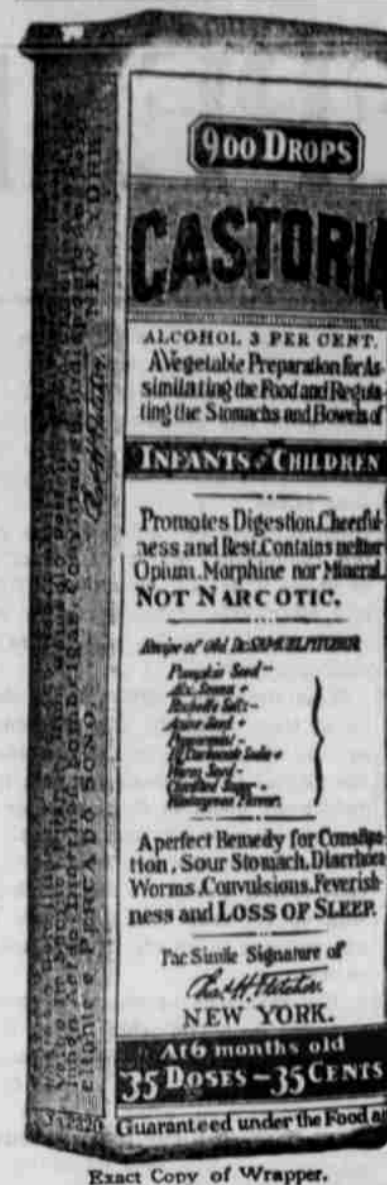
Misses Chamberlain and Birdie Evans spent the day Saturday fishing on Mill Creek.
