TRY TO SOLVE SEWER PROBLEM

(Continued from first page.)

liminary survey, etc."

"What was the reason you did not suggest this course to the council before the matter assumed the present status?"

"Owing to the personal feeling that has sprung up between the members of the council and me I had no opportunity to assist them in this matter. I may be mistaken but I am of the opinion the section on which I am basing my objections has been entirely overlooked by members of the council and they will agree with me that I am right in my contention when they read it."

Mr. Jones left Thursday morning for the coast but expects to be home to be present at the next meeting of the council.

Later on a representative of the Enterprise called upon Councilman Bohannon, chairman of the ordinance committee, under whose dictation the ordinance in question, referred to by Mayor Jones, was drawn, and that gentleman, in reply to the query, if he had read section 59 of chapter 7 of the city charter, said:

"Yes, and I was informed this morning that the mayor had made the statement publicly that the ordinance recently passed by the council was not in accordance with the provisions of the city charter and was therefore of no legal value, inasmuch as it provides for the issuing of bonds against the entire city instead of shutting property, as set down in the section referred to. The ordinance was drawn under the provision of section 43 of chapter 7 which reads as follows:

"SECTION 43. If the council declares by ordinance that a proposed improvement or repair shall be at the cost, in whole or in part, of the adjacent property, the proposed improvement or repair shall be made accordingly; but if it declares that the cost thereof, in whole or in part, shall be paid out of the general fund, such repairs may be made as the ordinance may provide, and be paid for accordingly."

"You can readily see that section 43 leaves it to the option of the council whether or not the improvement or repairs proposed shall be taxed up to the adjacent property or to the city as a whole. In this instance it was decided, after due deliberation, that the best method to adopt for the city would be by a bond issue of the entire city, they being more saleable on the market than improvement bonds issued against the adjacent property."

"By reading section 59 carefully it will be observed that it invests in the council power to 'law down all necessary sewers and drains and cause the same to be assessed on the property directly benefitted thereby,' if it sees fit to do so. But in no manner does it state that the council shall have the power to do the work and pay for the same out of the general fund as the ordinance may provide."

"In my judgement the grounds upon which the mayor bases his opinion of the non-legality of the ordinance are very flimsy. The ordinance committee, of which I am chairman, in connection with the city attorney fully analyzed the provisions of the city charter before drawing up and submitting the ordinance and I feel confident that it will stand the test of the courts if its legality is ever questioned."

"The trouble with the sewer question is that outside of the members of the city council and city officials who have been considering the matter for the past six months, the people are not conversant with the facts in the premises. If they had been there would have been no referendum petition, which was, in my opinion, the outgrowth of misrepresentations of the facts by interested parties. It is well known the more often a story is told the bigger it gets and this can be practically applied to the misrepresentations relative to the sewer proposition."

"It is now generally understood that the system proposed by the council takes in about forty blocks, practically the entire city with the exception of that portion known as old town or North Independence, and a small portion of West Independence. As the ordinance includes the sewerage of the entire city whenever the occasion demands it the people in old town can by petition have the sewer extended to that district. There should be little or no opposition to the sewer proposition from any quarter."

It will be observed that the members of the council are confident of the grounds on which they are working while the mayor is equally confident, believing that the council is in the mire. As to which is cor-

rect we leave it to the readers of the Enterprise to judge. Both sides are working under the same chapter of the city charter but under sections, each of which is explicit in provisions. It is, therefore, apparent that one or the other has misconstrued the law.

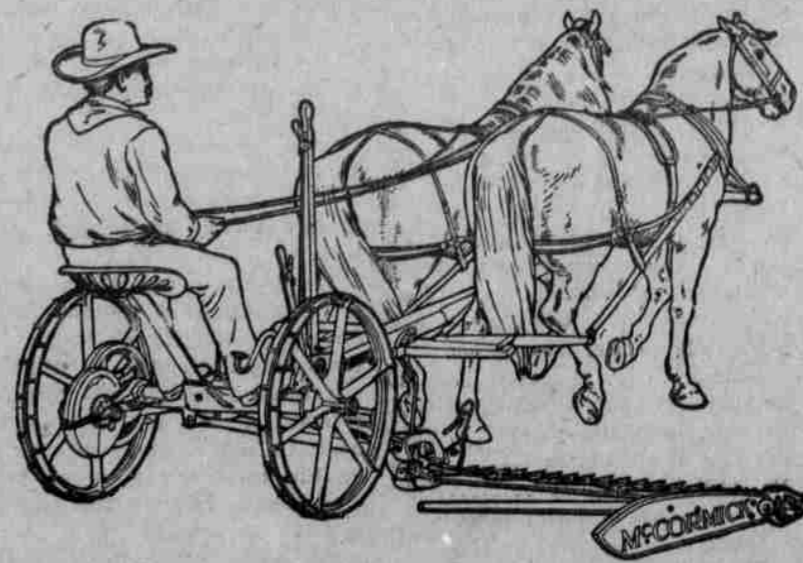
