CAN'T AGREE ON PRICE OF HAY

According to the Salem Statesman, the relations between farmers and feed men are a little strained at this time over the question of hay. Owing to the shortage in this vicinity farmers are holding out for higher price than that quoted throughout the winter, while the feed men believe that the hay now being baled is not up to its usual standard of quality, are not anxious to buy in large quantities at advanced prices.

Clover hay to the amount of several hundred tons was caught by the recent rains, but aside from being a few shades darker than otherwise it is not generally believed to have been injured to any great extent.

A good crop is reported from Eastern Oregon and some other sections of the state, which will put the market on a settled basis within a few weeks.

Ground alfalfa has found its way into the local feed stores, although this method of preparing hay is said to have originated in Eastern Oregon, where it grows to its greatest perfection.

Farmers are busily engaged in baling hay, although much of that cured has already been sold in the bulk.
