"If there should be anything serious, I will let the press know. As I have never deceived them, I ask that the press now withdraw its representatives and rely on me."

Hill Will Begin Contest in Speed.

Chicago, Sept. 1.—The railroad running time from Chicago to Seattle will be reduced to 62 hours—ten hours below the present schedule—as the first move in a war declared upon all other Western and Northwestern roads by James J. Hill, of the Great Northern, according to a story of the Record-Herald.

The Burlington, Great Northern and Northern Pacific have made a proposition to the Postoffice Department to put a new fast mail train in service between Chicago and Seattle to make the long run in 62 hours.

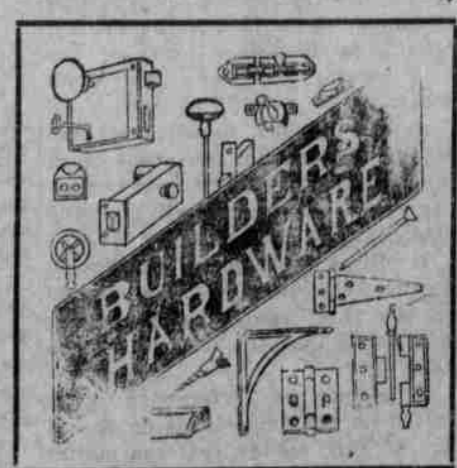
