## THREE DAYS YET TO PAY TAKES IN

At five o'clock next Monday afternoon, taxes unpaid will become delinquent and subject to penalty and interest.

During the past month the sheriff's office has been kept busy taking in tax money, and it is more than likely that the delinquent list will be small as usual.

Owing to the fact that the Oregon legislature repealed that section of the law, delinquent taxes are no longer advertised.

The new law provides that any day after the expiration of six months after the taxes charged against real property are delinquent, the tax collector shall upon demand and payment of taxes, interest and penalty, make out and issue a certificate of delinquency against such property. Such certificates shall bear interest from the date of issuance until redeemed at the rate of fifteen per cent per annum, and shall be sold to any person, in order of priority in applying therefor, upon the payment of the value in principal and interest thereof.

and lawfully engaged in some useful At any time after the expiration of three years from the first date of delinquency, the holder of such certificate may summon the delinquent to redeem his property, and if not so redeemed, the circuit court shall grant a decree foreclosing the lien against the property mentioned in such certificate.

Personal property upon which the tax is delinquent for a period of thirty days after the first Monday in April, or the first Monday in October, shall be sold for the payment of such tax and such sale shall be absolute.
