OFFICERS WILL MEET SATURDAY

The annual convention of the school officers of Polk county which will be held in the court house at Dallas, Saturday, November 6, bids fair to be one of the best conventions if not the best ever held in the county or state and Superintendent Seymour has received notice from directors from all parts of the county that they will be present and every indication is that every district in the county will be represented as they should be.

These conventions can do much for the schools of the county and state and in fact they have done and are doing much good. Every progressive school man or woman in the county should try and attend every school officers' convention as by talking over school questions with others all are strengthened and hence the schools are made stronger.

State Superintendent J. H. Ackerman, who has done more for the schools of the state than any other one man, will be present and will take part in the convention.

Following are some of the suggested subjects that will be discussed at the convention: if you have any others that you wish to have taken up mention it at the convention:

Better sanitation, ventilation, etc.; creation of a county high school fund; county treasurer should be made ex-officio school district treasurer; county unit of administration; special taxes; November census; employing of teachers; janitor work in rural schools; parents visiting schools or a parents' day; changes in school laws; compulsory education; how may the rural schools be improved?; county school fund; teachers' contracts; district board meetings; a model rural school building; grades above the eighth in one-room schools; transferring of school money from one school district to another; school debating.
