BOTH TEAMS WERE GRITTY

The foot ball game last Saturday between the team from the Corvallis athletic club and the athletic club of this city resulted scoreless. The game was the best exhibition of foot ball ever played in this county, in the opinion of people qualified to say. The day was ideal for the game but the attendance was not what it should have been. When the people begin to know that they can see first class foot ball here at home they will certainly give a better attendance at the games.

In opening, Independence kicked off and the ball was down on the thirty-five yard line. Corvallis failed to make yardage and Independence gained possession of the ball. Williams punted and Corvallis, failing to make yardage, punted also. Parker made eight yards through left left tackle for yardage. First down and ten to gain. Mattison made forward pass to Pomeroy which netted fifteen yards. Ball down on twenty-yard line. Corvallis held Independence for yardage and gained possession of the ball and punted to field. Independence got the ball and ran back for fifteen yards. Independence tried two delayed passes gaining four yards and lost possession of the ball. Corvallis played Ward through right tackle for yardage in two different plays. Ball down on Corvallis thirty yard line when time was called.

In the second half Corvallis kicked off and Mattison ran the ball back about fifteen yards. Independence tried Parker through left tackle for eight yards and Williams around right tackle for five yards. First down and ten yards to gain. Pomeroy was sent around left end for large gains and a series of line plays resulted in the loss of the ball to Corvallis. Ward was played through the line in several plays which netted Corvallis twenty-five yards gain. The position of the ball at this stage of the game was on Independence one yard line with Corvallis in possession of the ball. Ward was played through right tackle and Independence forced the ball back four yards gaining possession of it. Independence punted and Emerick downed the runner without gain to Corvallis. Corvallis was held for yardage and Independence tried end plays and line bucking for yardage. The ball was downed on Independence twenty yard line when the whistle blew.

In the first half Whitehorn of the Corvallis team tackled and was badly hurt. His jaw was broken on the left side and dislocated on the other. In the closing of the last half Jones of the Independence team, in an attempt to recover the ball on a fumble, came in contact with a player and received a black eye and a badly smashed bone of his face.

four seconds. Linn won six firsts and six seconds, Lane three firsts and two seconds, Marion one first and one second.

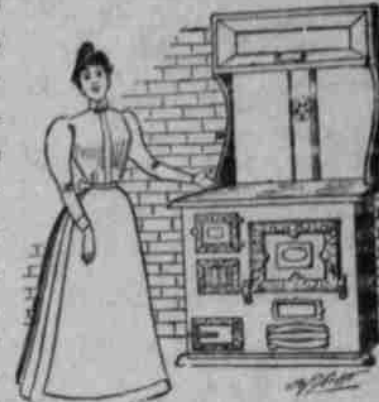
