## CANNERY IS TO BE LEASED OUT

A meeting of the directors of the Independence cannery was held Tuesday night when arrangements were made for the disposition of the pack of 330 cases of Royal Ann cherries which were put up season before last. The pack was sold to Allen & Lewis of Portland for \$1000.

Two parties are negotiating for the lease of the plant for a term of two or three years. Which one of the parties will secure it, if either does, will develop in a week or ten days. The directors favored the plan of leasing the plant for such a term in consideration of the payment of the insurance on the building and plant and the keeping up of the interest and taxes. This plan meets with general approval of the stockholders who have expressed their opinion on the matter.

One of the parties who is negotiating for the lease is a California man and the other is back east somewhere.
